Goshen Trail Tour a Success!

The Historical Society sponsored a bus tour of the Hamilton County portion of the Goshen Trail Saturday, October 25, 2008. According to Rick Moore, president of the Historical Society, this road spanned 150 miles from Shawneetown to the Edwardsville-area. This year marks the 200th anniversary of the first recorded reference to the Goshen Trail. Fifty-one individuals heard presentations about the Burns House; Riddle Tavern; Independence; Mellonsville (Cracker's Neck, Flint); Middletown; Knights Prairie Church and Cemetery; Cartwright Chapel Church and Cemetery; Smith Church and



These books are helpful in providing high school students with resources to help complete their freshman genealogy assignments.

Recent Genealogy Library and Museum Acquisitions



The genealogy library has recently acquired Family Maps of Hamilton County. Family Maps plats most all of the original federal land patents on user-friendly maps. We also have a copy of War, Politics, and Reconstruction: Stormy Days in Louisiana by Henry Clay Warmoth. Warmoth was born in McLeansboro, Illinois and became Governor of Louisiana from 1868-1872. A photo collage of our museum recently appeared in Vol. 25, Issue 5 of Springhouse magazine. The museum has recently acquired a picture of the McLeansboro Merchant Marine Band that appeared in the 1900 Special Supplement to the McLeansboro Times. Mrs. Jo DeWitt, daughter of M.E. Daniel, the Times editor at that time, contributed the picture. In addition, Dr. Alec and Kris Hood donated McLeansboro Township High School annuals for the years: 1930, 1935, and 1936. Thank you.
