

New Historical Signs Erected in 2009!

The Historic Sites Committee erected two signs in 2009. A sign commemorating the formation and history of Walpole was placed on July 9, 2009 in Walpole. A similar sign had been originally erected by Ralph Gray at the same site. The committee also replaced a sign denoting the dwelling of John Anderson as the place where Hamilton County's government was formed and the first officers were elected. The original sign was erected in 1981 near the McLeansboro Reservoir spillway. Many thanks go to Bob Barker, Rick Moore, Ronald Nelson, Dan Chapman, and W.N. Recent patrons have noticed the improved labeling and organization in the genealogy library. The Society has purchased 50 new hard plastic shelf files that can accommodate computergenerated labels. In addition, more than 150 of the family history, general history and cemetery binders have been replaced and uniformly labeled. Many thanks to Doris Nelson for making the labels, Ryan Nelson for donating binders and sheet protectors, and Micki Faruzzi for organizing the materials. We have recently added more than 25 genealogy books from Saline, Gallatin, and

Williamson County. We have more than 100 family histories or genealogies but we could always use more. Gary Burzynski recently donated a photograph and a commemorative booklet featuring Ray Blades. Blades was from Hamilton County and played for the St. Louis Cardinals during the 1920s and 30s and coached for the Cardinals and Cubs following his playing career. Another donation of several H. Allen Smith books came from Ryan Nelson. Smith was a McLeansboro native who had more than 4 million books in print. Titles include "Three Men on Third" "The

Pig in the Barber Shop" "Let the Crabgrass Grow" "Two Thirds of a Coconut Tree" "The View from Chivo" and "Low Man Rides Again." A scrapbook of school pictures belonging to former teacher Bill Smith was also given to the museum.




